I recently bought a Durst M600 enlarger used and it looks like the previous owner did not take a good care of it. It is dusty and rusty. I have managed to clean the dust and specks of rust from the outer body. I want to clean the dust out of hard to reach places and dust in the lens. Is there a service manual somewhere for the M600 enlarger that can help me to disassemble the unit, clean it in and out. If not, can someone please tell me the size of the screws, so that I can get the required bit to open it up. Thank you AYes, I already have that manual downloaded from the internet a few days back. I have taken the lens assembly off and wanted to know how can I clean the lens using the least intrusive way. Thank you AI assume you are asking about d3 the condenser. It has been several years since I took the condenser out of my 601 and cleaned it. The M 601 uses common sizes and types of screws to hold the lens in place. You may need a screw driver with an 8 inch long shaft to reach the screw heads depending on the housing. Pay attention to the order and direction of each element. Clean each element as you would any fine lens and handle by the edges only wearing cotton gloves. I have a M 601 and after wrestling with a slow computer I have the user manual scanned and converted to PDF. It was really very helpful. One more question, is it possible to take off Lamphouse d1. I know the roof cap d2 comes off easily, but I was wondering if I can remove d1 as well. Thank you ASee page 9 of the manual, How to dismantle. The M 601 is one piece where the M 600 separates into two pieces. I was able to clean the enlarger and other parts and now the enlarger looks quite sleek. Thank you again for all the help and advice. Also, the knob behind the lens that swings the red filter into place turns easily, and may have the filter impinging slightly on your image. Another thing to try would be the position of the bulb, the socket holding the bulb can be adjusted up and down, to center the lamp. I found a manual for your enlarger on this site, which may help if you don't have one; My mistake should have read the manual first but once I tried to put the opal glass in the filter holder do not make complete sense though. I believe the diffusing screen was intended to even out the light from a tube shaped bulb. The screen is positioned in the head and should not have caused your problem if installed correctly. I concur about the red filter. It swings all too easily and it does come in from the side, so could be causing your problem. If you do not use it, I suggest taping the knob, so the red filter is not accidentally move into the light path. Ahhhhhh light bulb goes on The negative carrier of the M600 has movable masking blades. I think the one on the left side might be mispositioned, and is slightly in the light path. Move ALL the masking blades OUT, and I think your problem will be solved. I never used the masking blades myself, as they were too far from the film plane to create a sharp cutoff. Visually it is little brighter but I did not make any test prints yet. But one the condensor glass is not seated properly i.e., one facing the bulb. But, have to wait till Friday. But then I used a

I have rediscovered some old ca. Does anyone have a PD. I regularly print from 35 m. I have I am the owner of a durst d659 enlarger, but it has a cracked condens. There are some trays which probably need replacing and a very old yellow box with a tin of Hypo Clear in it, unopened. What thread size enlarging lenses does this use. The enlarger has no provision for using multigrade filters. Is there a retrofit kit available, or do I just have to stick with graded papers The enlarger is rated for up to a 150w bulb, so dont worry about a 75w bulb. The problem with LED bulbs is the color spectrum is not always even, so your VC paper may not grade properly. Also the bulb has to illuminate from the side. The LED bulb that Ive seen when viewed from the side, half the round part is a solid piece of plastic. The LED bulb will only work where you use the top of the bulb to illuminate. Read the manual to vertically position the bulb. Lens is standard 39mm Leica lens thread. LOTS of good lenses out there now at great prices, just be patient and you will find some great deals. 80mm lenses are easier find than 75mm lenses for 6x6 negatives. There is a filter drawer in the head. Lift up on the horizontal bar on the front of the head, a small door will slide upwards, and the filter drawer is behind that. The negative carrier is a funky design. There is a glass plate or a mask on the carrier, and the top is the bottom of the condenser lens in the head. Easy to use, just different if you are used to the sandwich style negative carriers.

On an OLD enlarger you should take it apart and clean out the dust and dirt, and where necessary clean and relube the moving shafts. I used lithium grease from Ace Hardware. But be very careful to NOT lube where you should not. Also be very careful of that mirror. I think it is a front surfaced

mirror, if so it is VERY easy to scratch. Seems to be a good fit. The column moves smoothly, so I am not going to lubricate it. Had to cut down a set of Ilford filters for the filter drawer, which took less than 5 minutes. Only when photo bulbs are not available, would I use nonphoto bulbs. This is especially so if the diffusion glass is not in the head. As for the bulb wattage. I found that even 75 watts was many times too much light. I have no idea what an Iscorit lens is. Personally, I would go with the upper end ElNikkor, Rodenstock, or Schnieder lenses not APO those are too expensive. Their prices are really good on eBay if you are patient, so I would not bother with 3rd tier lenses. I completely rebuilt my lens kit, replacing my old 3rd tier lenses with ElNikkor lenses. Printing all the pictures Ive been saving up for the past 5 years and got some great results but I used the 75mm lens the whole time. I read that when printing 35mm you should use the 50mm lens but when I put it in I cant seem to get the neg in focus. It stays just a hair out of focus. Whats the deal Am I doing something wrong.

I read something about needed some sort of extender tube, could this be my issue. Thanks for all your help. Cheers, Zak Click to expand. What city you from. I never used M600 but the logic says shorter focal length, shorter distance from neg to the lens. If your 50 mm is all the way up and still you cannot get the right focus it would suggest, that there is something already installed, some extension for the longer 75 mm lens. But I might be wrong. Here is Durst M600 manual On page 15 they deal with lenses and mounting boards. I looked in the manual and came up with nothing Thanks for the efforts though. I am wondering if it could have something to do with the mounting board. It did come with an extra one. Ill try swapping boards and see what it gives me. Cheers There is a SIXTIF tube for 2835 mm lenses. 50 mm lens has to be closer to the negative then 80 mm so I am thinking you have SIXPLA panel installed. The question is, if you have SIXTUB somewhere. When I got my enlarger the guy at the shop installed my lens on a sixpla and put the sixtub board into a box and told me it was an extra. Put my 50mm onto the sixtub and voila. Good luck and have a fun in the darkroom. My mistake, forget what I said.
