

Ensure the drain spigot has a minimum hole size of 15 mm and that it has been drilled out. We recommend a cold water connection to give the best wash performance and energy efficiency. The information in this user guide must be followed to minimise the risk of fire or explosion, or to prevent property damage, personal injury or loss of life. Operational Use the dishw asher only for its intended function as described in this user guide. Dishw asher detergents are alkaline. They can be dangerous if sw allowed. Av oid contact with skin and eyes, and k eep children and infirm persons away from the dish washer when the door is open. Use only detergents or rinse aid recommended for use in a domestic dishw asher and k eep them out of reach of children. Check that the detergent dispenser is empty after the completion of each wash programme. When loading items to be washed, place sharp items where they are not likely to damage the dishwasher and load sharp knives with the handles up to reduce the risk of cut type injuries. Do not tamper with the controls of your dishw asher. Do not abuse, sit on, or stand on the door or dish rack of your dish washer. Do not place any heavy objects on the door when it is open. The dishwasher could tip forward. To reduce the risk of injury, do not allo w children to play in or on the dishw asher. Under certain conditions hydrogen gas may be produced in a hot w ater heater system that has not been used for two weeks or more. This will release any accum ulated hydrogen gas.

As hydrogen gas is flammable, do not smoke or use an open flame during this time. Remove the door to the w ashing compartment when removing an old dishw asher from service or discarding it. Open the door very carefully if the dishwasher is in oper ation. There is a risk of being spray ed with hot water. Do not open the door fully until the spray arm has stopped rotating. The door should not be left in the open position as this could present a tripping hazard. When disconnecting the dishwasher pull by the plug rather than the cord or junction of cord to avoid damage. This dishwasher is not intended for use by young children or infirm persons unless they have been adequately supervised by a responsible person to ensure that they can use the dishwasher safely. Young children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the dishwasher. The water inside the dishw asher is not suitable for drinking. This dishw asher is designed for washing normal household utensils. Items that are contaminated by petrol, paint, steel or iron debris, or corr osive, acidic or alk aline chemicals are not to be washed in this dish washer. If the dishwasher is not being used for long periods of time, turn the electricity and water supply to the dishwasher off. If the power supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or Authorised Service Centre or a similarly gu alified person in order to avoid a hazard. Ensure the dishwasher is plac ed between cabinetry. F ailure to do so may result in an unstable product, which may cause damage or injury. Do not operate this dishw asher if it is damaged, malfunctioning, partially disassembled or has missing or broken parts, including a damaged power supply c ord or plug. Do not store or use petrol or other flammable vapours and liquids in the vicinity of the dishw asher. Connect to a properly rated, protected and size d pow er supply circuit to avoid electrical ov erload.

Make sure that the pow er supply cord is positioned where it will not be stepped on, tripped ov er, or otherwise subjected to damage or stress. Do not install or store the dishwasher where it will be exposed to temper atures below freezing or exposed to the weather. Do not use an extension cord or por table electrical outlet device eg multisock et outlet box to connect the dishwasher to the power supply. Maintenance Do not repair or replace any part of the dishwasher or attempt any servicing unless specifically recommended in this user guide. Keep the floor around your dish washer clean and dry to reduce the possibility of slipping. Keep the area around and underneath your dish washer free from the ac cumulation of combustible materials, such as lint, paper, rags and chemicals. When cleaning the underside of the filter, tak e care on the sharp outer edge to avoid the risk of cut type injuries. If the dishwasher is not operating properly or maintenance must be performed, disc onnect the dishwasher from the power supply. It is the responsibility of the plumber and electrician to ensure that each installation complies with the Government and local gov ernment bylaws. Check

packaging and dishwasher immediately for signs of transport damage. The dishwasher must not be connected to the electrical supply while installation is being carried out. Ensure all domestic wiring is properly earthed. Never lift from the door handle. Do not lift from the decorative panel on the front of the dish washer. Always be careful with the hoses and the power cor d at the back of the dishwasher. Careful handling will prevent damage and malfunction from squashing, kinking or cuts. The dishwasher should not be connected to a hot water sy stem where the temperatur e exceeds 60C, or where there is no temperatur e control, eg wetback system unless the sy stem is fitted with a suitable tempering valve.

The dishwasher must not be connected to an under sink high pr essure "push through "type hot water system, as damage to the syst em will result. Ensure the bare wood surrounding the dishwasher is sealed with an oilbased paint or moistur e proof polyurethane to pr event possible steam damage. While installing a dishwasher, check the drain hose is not restricted or kinked. Lev elling Before sliding the dish washer into position, adjust the feet to ensure that the dishwasher is level at the required height. Check that the door opens and closes freely without resistance to adjacent cabinetry. The dishwasher should not be inclined more than 2. If the dishwasher is level it will help to ensur e optimum performance. It is not recommended that the drain hose or drain pipe be connected directly to a waste disposal unit see diagram 2. When connecting the drain hose to a sink trap with a drain hose spigot, it is important that the drain hose is supported to the height of the bench see diagram 3. Ensure the drain spigot has a minimum hole size of 15 mm and that it has been drilled out. We recommend a c old water connection to give the best wash performance and energy efficiency. Important! The appliance should be connected to the water main using a new hose set. Old hose sets should not be used. If the length of the water inlet hose is not long enough to mak e a proper connection, it must be replaced. W ater supply The dishwasher inlet hose must be connected to an acc essible water tap. The hose coupling must be tightened a further half turn after seal contact If the water pipes have not been used for an extended period of time, let the wat er run to make sure that the water is clear and free of impurities. If this precaution is not taken, there is a risk the water inlet will get blocked and damage the appliance.

Antiflood protection This dishwasher has an antiflood pr otection which will stop the water flowing in the event of a damaged hose or a leak within the machine. P ositioning your dish washer Position the appliance in the desired location. The inlet water and drain hoses can be positioned to the right or left to assist proper installation. Built under or built in appliances should be installed under a continuous sur face, which is attached to adjacent cupboards, in order to ensure that the applianc e is stable. The dishwasher may be installed with the top panel removed. Electrical Connection Ensure the voltage and fr equency values for the current in your home corr esponds to those on the rating plate located on the stainless steel inner door of your dish washer, and that the electrical system is correct for the maximum voltage on the rating plat e. Insert the plug into an electrical socket which is ear thed properly the earthing of the appliance is a safety requirement mandated by law. Important! The dishw asher plug must be acc essible even when the appliance is installed as a builtin unit so that maintenance can be done safely. If a fault occurs If the dishwasher malfunctions, turn off the water supply to the appliance and disconnect the plug from the wall socket. Refer t o the T roubleshooting sec tion. All the pr ogramme indicators will light up. 7 Press the P rog ramme button to select a wash programme. After five seconds, the selected wash indicator light will flash when the pr ogramme is in progress, the dishwasher will beep once and the wash pr ogramme will start automatically. The Time Remaining display will display the estimat ed time for the programme models DW60CDW2 and DW60CDX2 only. At the end of the wash cycle, your dish washer will beep six times, and all the programme indicators will light up. 8 Leav e the door slightly ajar to improve the drying per formance. 9 After several minutes, set the POWER switch to OFF.

Do not open the door fully until the spray arm has stopped rotating. If the door is left open during the wash c ycle the dishwasher will beep ten times ev ery thir ty seconds. When the dishwasher has been paused and the dish washer has heated the water, leave the door ajar for several minut es and then close. Other wise, the dish washer door may open due to expansion. Cancelling or modifying the pr ogramme A wash cycle can be modified if it has only been running for a short time. The detergent dispenser may need to be refilled. To cancel and reset a programme Models DW60CDW2 and DW60CD X2 Press the Reset butt on. One beep will sound, and all the prog ramme indicators will light up, to indicate that the current prog ramme was cancelled successfully. You can now select a new wash programme. Models DW60CSW1 and DW60CSX1 Press the P o wer button. Memory function models DW60CDW2 and DW60CD X2 only If the power supply is switched off during a cycle, or the POWER button is accidentally pushed, your dishwasher is able to remember the current setting and place in the wash cycle. It will then start automatically after the selected time. Note to cancel the Delay Start setting, pr ess the Reset button. Normally soiled dishes for optimum energy usage. V ery lightly soiled mixed dishes. Rinses dishes that hav e been stacked for several days in the dishwasher prior to washing. Light to normally soiled dishes for optimum energy and water usa ge. Lightly soiled delicate items. W ash times are only approximate on the display. Remember, if in doubt about any items to be washed in the dishwasher, follow the instructions from the manufacturer of the items, or wash them by hand.

Cutlery and silverware All cutlery and silver ware should be rinsed immediately after use to prevent tarnishing caused by some foods. The Rinse wash programme is useful f or this. Silv er items should not come into contact with stainless steel, for example other cutlery. Mixing these items can cause staining. Remove silver cutlery from the dishwasher and hand dry it immediately after the programme has finished. Aluminium Aluminium can be dulled by dishwasher deter gent. The deg ree of change depends on the quality of the product. Other metals Iron and cast iron items can rust and stain other items. C opper, pewter and brass tend to stain. W oodware W ooden items are generally sensitive to heat and water. Regular use in the dishwasher may cause deterioration over time. If in doubt, wash by hand. Glassware Most everyday glassware is dishwasher saf e. Crystal, very fine and antique glassware may etch become opaque. You may prefer to wash these items by hand. Plastic Some plastic may change shape or colour with hot water. Check the manufac turer's instructions about washing plastic items. W ashable plastic items should be weighed down so they do not flip over and fill with water, or fall through the basket during the wash. Decorat ed items Most modern china patterns are dishwasher saf e. Antique items, those with a pattern painted over the glaze or gold rims, or hand painted china may be mor e sensitive to machine washing. If in doubt, wash these items by hand. Glued items Certain adhesives are softened or dissolved by machine washing. If in doubt, wash glued items by hand. Never put highly absorbent materials, such as sponges and t owels in y our dishwasher. Do not put dishes or cutlery that have been soiled by tobacco ash, wax, lubricating grease or paint in your dishwasher. If there are any items blocking the spray arms' paths or the wash water, then the per formance will be ineffective.

Before placing the dishes in the dish washer, remove larger food particles to prevent the filt er from becoming clogged. If the pots and pans have bakedon food residue that is extremely hard to r emove, we recommend that they are soaked bef ore being washed. This will eliminate the need for extra wash cycles. How to load the low er rack The tines on the lower rack can be f olded down so large it ems like pots and pans can be placed flat on the basket. We recommend that you place the most difficulttoclean items on the lower rack pots, pans, lids, serving dishes and bowls. Place serving dishes and lids on the sides of the racks to avoid blocking the rotation of the top spray arm. The cutlery basket can be halved as shown in Fig 4, so that you can use just one section when the cutlery load is light. This also makes space f or additional pots and pans. Place cutlery in the cutler y basket

with the handles at the bottom. If the rack has side baskets, place spoons individually into the appropriate slots. Place long utensils in the horiz ontal position at the front of the upper rack. Place knives and other utensils with sharp points in the basket with their points down, or in a horizontal position. Fig. 4 Cutlery basket P osition these items so that they cannot be mov ed during the wash. Upper rack adjustment for models DW60CSW1 and DW60CSX1 The upper rack can be adjusted for height by using the rollers located on both sides of the rack see below. Adjusting the upper rack to a higher level will g ive you mor e space to acc ommodate taller items in the lower rack. Never sprinkle or pour detergent directly onto any item in the dishw asher. Hand washing liquids, soap, laundry detergents or disinfectants will damage your dishwasher. Filling the det ergent dispenser 1 Press the butt on on the top of the dispenser to open the cov er. 2 Pour the det ergent for the wash cycle into the larger main detergent compartment.

3 Pour the det ergent for the pr ewash c ycle into the smaller pre wash detergent compartment. 4 Remove any excess deter gent from the edges of the dispenser. 5 Close the cover and press down until it clicks into place. The detergent will automatically be r eleased into the dishwasher during the wash programme. In addition it prevents metal from tarnishing. The rinse aid dispenser is located on the inside panel of the door. Filling the rinse aid dispenser 1 Open the dispenser by turning the cap in an anticlockwise direction. 2 Pour the rinse aid int o the dispenser, making sure not to overfill. T ake care not to spill rinse aid into the dishwasher. Any spills must be wiped up to prevent ex cess f oaming. F ailure to wipe up rinse aid spills may result in a service call, which will not be covere d by war rant y. 3 Fit the cap back in the original position. How much rinse aid to use The dose regulator may need to be adjusted to suit your water conditions. Regulat e the amount of rinse aid by turning the dose regulator, using a screwdriver. The dose regulator is located underneath the rinse aid cap. If there is exc essive foaming at the end of the wash, reduce the setting. If dishes are wet or str eaky after dr ving, increase the setting. Rinse Aid indicator light When the rinse aid level becomes low, the Rinse Aid indicator will light up to remind you to refill the rinse aid.

The Rinse Aid indicator light can be found on the deter gent dispenser cover for all models, and on the exterior contr ol panel for models DW60CDW2 and DW60CD X2. Cleaning the outer surfaces Fr om time to time the wash prog ramme indicator panel and its surrounds need to be cleaned to remove f ood particles, and any spillages. We recommend wiping these ar eas with a clean, soft damp cloth, and drying them with a clean lintfree cloth. Important! We do not recommend the use of the following cleaning aids on y our dishw asher, as they may damage the surfaces Plastic or stainless steel scouring pads. Abrasive, solvent house hold cleaners. Hand washing liquids or soaps. Laundry detergents or disinfec tants. Cleaning the door seals If food is trapped in the seals, then it can cause odours. Clean the seals periodically with a clean damp cloth to prevent this fr om happening. Holiday time If your dishwasher is not going to be used f or some time, we recommend you ensure the baskets are empty. Leave the inside of the dishwasher clean. L eav e the door ajar to allow air to cir culate. Turn off both the pow er and water supply to your dish washer. You should car efully inspect your dishwasher regularly. Check that no grease or scale has accumulated on the inside of your dish washer. I f you discov er any deposits, clean them thoroughly with warm water on a soft, lintfree cloth. Filt ers The filters A and B prev ent larger particles of food in the water from reaching the pump. These par ticles may occasionally block the

filters. We recommend that the drain filter is cleaned whenever there is evidence of food particles. When the dishwasher has finished washing, check the filters for particles of food and, if required, clean.

After removing the coarse micr ofilter filter A, the filter unit filter B can be remov ed. Remov e any particles of food and rinse the filters under running water. Replace the filter unit B and then the coarse microfilter A. Ensure that the microfilter is tightened firmly. Spray arms Lime and remnants of food in the wash water can block the nozzles in the spray arms and the arm mountings The spray arms and mountings may need cleaning about once a month in normal use or more often should the need arise Inspect the nozzles in the spray arms for blocked holes. If necessar y, unscr ew the lower arm C and lift it off. Unscrew the upper spray arm D. Clean both spray arms under running water. Refit the spray arms. Ensur e that the lower spray arm is locked into place and the upper one is screw ed tightly. Important! The dishwasher must be used with the filter plate, drain filter and spray arms correctly in place. Where there is broken crock ery or glass in the dishwasher, carefully and immediately remove it to prevent damage.
